<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Maps</u></p> <p>Draw and/ or label a map of Ancient Greece showing places of historic interest and importance! (cities, monuments, physical features such as mountains, label the seas etc)</p> <p>You could also add facts about ancient and modern day Greece.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">6 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Mythical Beasts</u></p> <p>Draw, paint or create your very own mythical beast- what would it look like? Where would it be found? Is it nice or evil? What are its strengths and weaknesses? Find out about some of the beasts in Greek mythology (Medusa, the Minotaur...)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">4 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Story</u></p> <p>Write an adventure story based on a Greek character, God or mythical beast. Choose a main character and setting and think about a problem and resolution. Use our story structure: Opening, build up, problem, resolution, ending.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">8 points</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Poetry</u></p> <p>Write a poem inspired by a Greek God, Hero or mythical beast. Ask an adult to help you search google for ideas and images.</p> <p>Or any piece of art or poster to show your word wheel spellings</p> <p style="text-align: center;">10 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Top Trumps</u></p> <p>Create top trump cards for the Greek Gods, heroes and mythical beasts so children can play!</p> <p style="text-align: center;">6 points</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Cartoon strip</u></p> <p>Create a cartoon of your own Greek story. Think of characters (Gods, heroes and beasts) from Greek mythology or create your own. Draw your pictures and use some dialogue. Create a presentation (poster, computer slides, annotated pictures, text) to share this information with others.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">8 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Greek Feast</u></p> <p>Learn about Greek food. Explore difference foods and dishes. Write a Greek food menu or instructions on how to cook a Greek dish.
