<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Map Work</u></p> <p>Draw or create your own map of the major oceans and seas with facts and information about each. You could include older maps of what people once thought the world looked like.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">6 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Nature documentary</u></p> <p>Could you be the next David Attenborough? Film your own nature documentary. You could focus on the sea at West Bay or choose another local setting such as a forest or the river Brit. You can choose. Focus on information about the wildlife and habitat. You could also talk about the impact of humans on this environment.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">6 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Story:</u></p> <p>Write a story about an ocean adventure. Use popular stories for ideas: Treasure Island, The Odyssey, 10,000 leagues under the sea. Remember: Show not tell (describe the settings and use the senses to describe characters feelings and reactions- rather than just telling what happened) <i>Also see 'tales of the seas' for story ideas.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;">8 points</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Sustainable oceans</u></p> <p>Create a presentation (computer or poster) on the impact humans have had on the oceans. What threats or problems do we face and what solutions could there be?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">8 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Tales of the seas</u></p> <p>Find and read stories, myths and legends based around the oceans. Write out the stories in your own words or record yourself telling them so we can share with the class. Consider- Poseidon (God of the seas), Moby Dick, the mystery of the Mary Celeste, The Bermuda Triangle, tales of mermaids, the city of Atlantis!</p> <p style="text-align: center;">8 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Recycled Creations</u></p> <p>Design and make your own submarine or any sea vessel. You could use a range of materials that would otherwise be thrown out- cardboard, plastic containers, tins and anything you can get your hands on!</p> <p style="text-align: center;">6 points</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Treasure maps</u></p> <p>Create your own treasure map. This could contain coordinates, clues, codes and riddles to help us find the treasure chest!</p> <p style="text-align: center;">4 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Art</u></p> <p>Create a piece of artwork based on the sea. This can be anything that appeals to you- drawing, painting, sculpting etc. Ask an adults permission to look at artists such as: Zaria Forman, Hokusai or Monet to begin with.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">4 points</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Deep Sea Adaptations: Create your own</u></p> <p>Create your deep sea creature. Draw or create an image of it with detailed facts about its appearance, diet, habitat and fascinating facts.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">6 points</p>
